The seminar will address such issues as international framework on cybercrime and e-Evidence, conflicts of jurisdiction and cross-border access to data, remote access to digital data, open source evidence, international cooperation in criminal matters, including the EIO.

Judges and prosecutors from all member States will be involved in a series of practical workshops, working on case scenarios inspired by real facts and involving both national laws and cross-border judicial cooperation. Participants will be assisted by international and national experts, including Europol and Eurojust representatives. Participants will comment on the practical cases according to their national legal systems and, most importantly, learn about their colleagues' systems in counterpart Member States.
